
The Joint Secretaries of the Joint Negotiating Council for the Education and Library Boards have examined the above Circular and have agreed the amended provision as attached at Appendix A.

PART 2 APPENDIX 4: TOOL ALLOWANCES

3. STORAGE OF TOOLS AND CLOTHING

- 3.1 Where practicable and reasonable on a site or job or in a shop, the employer shall provide an adequate lock-up box or lock-up boxes where tools can be left at the owners risk. In instances where employees are required to visit a number of sites on a regular and ongoing basis as part of their normal duties the vehicle designated for this purpose shall also be used for locking up tools. These requirements provide always that the employer shall accept liability up to a maximum of £449 (with effect from the pay week including 1 April 2000) for any losses caused by fire or theft to tools properly secured by an employee in such a locked facility.

STORAGE OF TOOLS AND CLOTHING

Circular CR 2/00 informed you that the agreement covering the storage of tools and clothing was being reviewed. Discussions on this advice have now been concluded and the amended provision is attached at Appendix A. This includes the following provision for the use of vehicles as a secured lock up as:

"In instances where employees are required to visit a number of sites on a regular and ongoing basis as part of their normal duties the vehicle designated for this purpose shall also be used for locking up tools."
